26 year old Mukhtiyar - LRBT's 41 millionth patient!

LRBT recently treated its 41 millionth patient and has impacted the lives of millions more by enabling the treated to go back to leading fulfilling lives.



26 years old and the only bread earner of a household of eight, Mukhtiyar is a security guard in a private bank. He had high hopes for a better future when he initially got the job 4 years ago, and being the eldest he was

relieved that his father would not have to share the burden of running the house alone. With 5 younger siblings, his father already had too many mouths to feed. Only three of his siblings are enrolled in school while the two younger ones stay at home with their mother.

Mukhtiyar still remembers the day he got his first paycheck - the look of pride on his father's face and the tears of happiness rolling down his mother's eyes. He shouldered the burden of his siblings' education from that day on. Mukhtiyar did not know then that soon he would have no choice but to be responsible for the roof over their heads and food on the table. The signs were always there but due to lack of awareness and inability to afford good medical care, his father's rapidly deteriorating health was blamed on overwork and stress. It was only when Mukhtiyar took a loan and got his father examined at a good hospital that he was diagnosed with stage 3 lung cancer. His father, a strong self-made man broke down in front of Mukhtiyar upon hearing the news, he refused any treatment and locked himself in

the house. The family's grief was palpable, a man who had spent his life caring for his family now had his days numbered. Mukhtiyar's life came to a standstill. He goes to work at 6 a.m. and returns at 8 p.m., after that he is his father's constant companion. He barely sleeps at night, having to help his father with washroom runs and trying to make life as comfortable as he can for him. Previously a social person, he became a recluse and cut off ties with all his friends and acquaintances.

He was so busy caring for his father that he scarcely noticed when his own affliction struck. Initially his vision would get blurred at times but as the months passed he was unable to see at all from his right eye and had limited vision in his left one. His mother finally convinced him to go to a local clinic and get it checked where he was diagnosed with cataract in both eyes and advised immediate surgery. Mukhtiyar felt his life come crashing down around him, he did not know how



he would get the money for treatment and without surgery he would surely go blind. His family would have no source of income, no roof over their heads and another family member dependent on them for his every need. His mother was shattered, she prayed with all her heart for their troubles to go away and perhaps it was in answer to her heartfelt plea that a colleague at work told Mukhtiyar about LRBT Korangi Hospital and its free eye care services for the poor.

Mukhtiyar had a successful surgery and is back at work now, he feels like he has truly been given a second shot at life. "My father has decided to opt for treatment and finally my family sees a ray of hope after seeing me overcome my ordeal. I do not have words to describe how LRBT not only gave me my sight back but something much more valuable ... Hope for the future."

Coping with the ever-growing patient volume

LRBT started off as a small mobile unit in Tando Bago over 33 years ago. Over the years, it has spread throughout the Country with 19 Hospitals and 58 Eye Care Centers. The journey of growth and expansion continues.

Korangi:

With the availability of state-of-the-art diagnostic equipment for our sub specialties, paucity of space was being felt, necessitating a dedicated wing for Pediatrics and consultation rooms for all the sub specialties that we are offering at the Tertiary Hospital. This project is being financed by our long-time supporter, Ms. Khurshid Bhaimia. The Bhaimia Family had earlier sponsored the entire second floor of the main hospital building. Later, the family financially supported the entire construction of a new section in which the new Outpatient Department is housed. This project is now being constructed on the first floor of the OPD and is expected to complete by end February 2020.

CEHC TOBA TEK SINGH

Operating since November 2008, the Community Eye Health Center at Toba Tek Singh has an average of 120 patients visiting it every working day. Last year, 36,000 patients were examined of which 7,015 were refracted while 3,648 requiring further investigation, surgery or treatment were referred to our nearest Secondary Hospital located at Lar, which is a 3-hour bus ride away. One of GLT's long-standing and loyal supporters, Mr. Arshad Ali offered to upgrade this center through renovation and remodeling. Civil work started in October 2018 and was completed in mid-January 2019. We are grateful to the Ali Family for its generous support, which enabled us to bring about a qualitative change in the environment by making it comfortable for the poor patients who visit this facility.

Partnership Agreements

LRBT gives credit to its partners for its success and is proud to work with them in ongoing projects:

Government of Sindh

This fiscal year a grant of Rs. 70 million from the Government of Sindh was allocated to LRBT to carry out sight restoring cataract surgeries on the poor and deserving patients living in the province. These surgeries are being conducted in all the five Sindh Hospitals. So far we have conducted 6,851 surgeries in this quarter. We are grateful to the Government of Sindh for its generous support.



need to increase children's access to eye health continues to provide eye wear to children under this program. This is being implemented by LRBT at all the hospitals in its network.

During this quarter, we conducted OPD of 60,746 children of which 892 were refracted and 393 glasses are being provided to them.

CBM International

This calendar year we are required to carry out 3,000 sight restoring cataract surgeries at three designated hospitals in our network. These are located at Tando Bago, Rashidabad and Quetta. This project is progressing smoothly, according to schedule. In a related development, LRBT is also being supported by CBM to train 22 mid-level eye care personnel at our School of Paramedicine in our newly introduced Two Year Diploma course. The induction process was completed in the last quarter and their academic session commenced in January this year.



Sightsavers



Sightsavers and LRBT signed a partnership agreement under which we are conducting sight restoring cataract surgeries at LRBT's four designated hospitals. The project is spread over a period of three years. It was launched in August last year. In this quarter, we have been able to accomplish 4,194 cataract surgeries according to plan.

In a separate arrangement, LRBT has been allocated 1,700 sight restoring cataract surgeries which are to be conducted during the period January 2019 to December 2019. A total of 280 surgeries have been accomplished so far.

Under the Seeing is Believing program of Standard Chartered Bank in partnership with



Sightsavers, LRBT is required to carry out refraction, cataract and minor surgeries over a period of 3½ years. This program was launched in beginning July 2016 at its hospitals in Mansehra and Swat. In order to support this project, LRBT has also been provided with ophthalmic equipment. The surgeries' target set for the year 2019 is 6,600. In this quarter, we have been able to conduct 1,641 cataract surgeries.

i-Care Foundation

In order to reduce preventable blindness amongst the poor and needy males and females, i-Care Foundation inked an agreement with LRBT on 30th March 2019 under which we shall be conducting 140 cataract surgeries during the period April 2019 to June 2019. The hospital designated for this purpose is our facility at Gambat.

Medical Relief International

An MoU was signed with MRI which is an independent non-profit organization existing under the charity laws of England and Wales based in Birmingham, UK.



Initially, we were required to carry out 21 cataract surgeries on poor females at our hospital in Mandra and 7 sight restoring surgeries on children at our Tertiary Teaching Hospital, Multan Road, Lahore. The project is progressing as planned. We look forward to a long-term partnership with this organization.

State-of-the-art Equipment and Technology

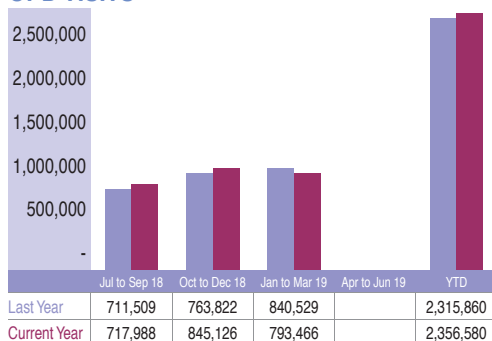

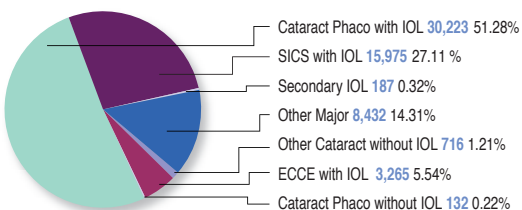

A total of 1,476 patients were examined, out of which 931 were medicated, 575 refracted and 330 were referred to LRBT Hospitals for detailed examination and surgery.
