MUZZAMIL

IS BACK TO SCHOOL...



12 year old, Muzzamil is a resident of a village near Quetta. Studying in grade 3 he is a cheerful and friendly child. The teachers are all praises for him for being a most avid student. During break time at school while

playing with his friends a ball hit him on his right eye, he doubled over in pain and cried out. His friends immediately alerted the teachers who called his father. Muzzamil's father, Anwar immediately rushed him to the basic health unit in their village, however due to dearth of facilities he was just given some painkillers and sent home. The pain eased but over time a white dot started to appear in his eye, he also started complaining of hazy vision.

Helpless his parents searched for options to take their son for a proper diagnosis. Anwar was jobless at the time due to his health issues, his two older sons were doing odd jobs and supporting the family. Muzzamil is his third child and with 5 younger



daughters to support he was worried about the finances for his son's treatment. Muzzamil's mother was distraught, her child's smile was gone and he was constantly worried that he would go blind and have to drop out of school.

She left no stone unturned, she asked everyone she knew about a good doctor or hospital where she could take him for a correct diagnosis. Through a stroke of luck her brother residing in Karachi

knew about LRBT, he came to the hospital and informed them that his sister could not afford to bring her son to Karachi for treatment and if there was any branch nearby to her residence. They told him about LRBT Quetta and he immediately called his sister and informed her. She convinced her husband to take Muzzamil for a checkup saying she would borrow money for his treatment if need be.



Anwar took Muzzamil to LRBT Quetta for a checkup. He was diagnosed with cataract and given a date for surgery. He informed the doctor of their financial situation and was assured that Muzzamil's treatment would be free of cost and they would not even have to pay for the medicines. He had a successful surgery and is back home recovering. He cannot wait to go back to school and seeing her son back to his usual chirpy self his mother upon leaving the hospital said, *"We can withstand any pain but seeing our children suffering and helpless to do anything is something I would not wish upon anyone. LRBT was a savior for us and we thank Allah for enabling us to come to this hospital where treatment was not only free but of the highest quality also. We are at peace now that we know our child will recover completely and will be able to lead a fulfilling, productive life."*

LRBT started off as a small mobile unit in Tando Bago over 36 years ago. Over the years, it has spread throughout the country with 19 hospitals and 59 primary eye care clinics and 4 out reach clinics The journey of growth and expansion continues.

RahimYarKhan | New Hospital

In the District of Rahim Yar Khan, quality of life for people with threatened or existing visual impairment and their participation in social life and society in general has greatly been impacted due to the absence of eye health care facilities especially for the poor and due to affordability issues as they cannot visit private clinics due to prohibitive costs.

A new, purpose built Hospital in Rahim Yar Khan has long been under consideration of the Board of Trustees, LRBT which has now been approved. Following acquiring of a suitable plot of land and completion of tendering process, construction work is expected to be launched in the latter half of January 2022. The project is planned to be completed in two years.

Our long standing and loyal donor in Abu Dhabi is providing full financial support for purchase of land and construction of this hospital. In the past he had sponsored major renovation and expansion at Khanewal, Gambat Hospitals This was followed by a new OPD and surgical complex at Lar and presently construction of a new hospital building at Mandra.

Mandra

Mandra Hospital is a major unit in our network of 19 hospitals and in addition to receiving patients from its catchment areas, it serves patients referred from our hospitals in KPK where some diagnostic tools and treatment is not available for certain eye ailments. Over the years and with the increase in the number of patients, there was need felt to construct a purpose built hospital which would offer efficient services, provide a comfortable environment to the visitors and sufficient space to house various sub specialty clinics.

Mandra Construction at a glance

Considerable progress has been made following the laying of the first floor concrete slab during November. Brick masonry work is almost complete on all floors while walls/ceiling plaster work is in advanced stages. Electrical, plumbing and tile work is progressing at a satisfactory pace. Paintwork was initiated in various areas of the building. Front elevation has also begun as has been the boundary wall on the front side. The scheduled completion date of this project is August 2022.

Gambat

There has been an ever-increasing volume of patients requiring surgery who have to wait for their operation to take place due to limited capacity which necessitated the need to construct an additional new and large operation theatre to augment the present activity. This has also provided us with the opportunity to remodel the present arrangement for safer movement of patients and OT staff in the theatre. It also required a block of toilets which is being added.

Civil work began in October 2021. Concrete slab of the new OT is expected to be laid early January. The new OT, renovated sections and allied services are expected to become operational in March 2022.

PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENTS

LRBT gives credit to its partners for its success and is proud to work with them on ongoing projects:



A partnership agreement with LRBT was signed last year requiring us to perform a total of 6853 cataract surgeries at Sibi and to target the

marginalized, disadvantaged poor populace residing in the peripheral areas of Quetta, Gwadar and Turbat, the southwestern coast of Balochistan, over a period of three years. During the month of Oct- Dec 2021, 752 surgeries were performed. The cumulative number of surgeries that have

been performed so far under this project totals 1663. We are also in contact with various health Authorities to spread awareness about the availability of these services at our Sibi facility.

Camps for the disabled under the UKAM project were restarted after a pause necessitated by a fresh outbreak of the global pandemic and successfully concluded in October 2021. Total 136 Eye Camps took place under this project.

Brien Holden Foundation



In collaboration with BHVI, LRBT operates six

optical shops at our Korangi, Gambat, Lar, Multan Road, Lahore, Mandra and Akora Khattak Hospitals which provide quality eye wear at affordable prices to the people who visit these facilities. It saves them the inconvenience and expenditure to go elsewhere looking for spectacles.

LRBT continues to team with BHVI as part of a global effort emphasizing the need to increase children's access to eye health and continues to provide eye wear to children through "Childrens' Vision Campaign". For ease and convenience of children and their parents, these spectacles are now being made available at all the Hospitals. During this quarter this year, we conducted OPD of 59,777 children of which 17,099 were refracted and 1,022 glasses are being provided to them.

CBM International



This wide ranging project to strengthen health systems through inclusive and quality eye care has been progressing steadily during the period under review as the project gathers ground in Tehsil Sadiqabad, District Rahimyarkhan, Punjab in collaboration with the Government in which LRBT is the implementing partner.

The following milestones were achieved during the last quarter:

1. LRBT started Low vision clinic in October 2021 at THQ Hospital, Sadiqabad.
2. LRBT purchased and provided State of the art ophthalmic equipment for Operation Theater which were installed in November 2021
3. 18 community awareness sessions were organized by the social mobilizers under the project to raise awareness regarding eye health care, newly

established eye services in Sadiqabad Tehsil and CNIC issuance process of person with disabilities at village/mohalla level.

4. LRBT arranged training for three officials of Punjab Health Facility Management Company and District Health Authority at Pakistan Institute Management, Karachi on monitoring skills for the capacity building of stakeholders

5. Field Superintendent visited 24 health facilities for measurement & finalization of BOQ to improve accessibility for persons with disabilities according to accessibility audit.

6. LRBT organized 01-day training on Disability inclusion and role responsibilities for Disabled Person Organizations & Self Help Groups. Total 30 members from 12 disabled person Organizations and 72 members from 24 Self Help Groups were trained.

7. LRBT provided IT equipment (01 laptop & 01 printer for each) to project focal persons of District Health Authority (DHA) Rahim Yar Khan and Punjab Health Facility Management Company (PHFMC) Rahim Yar Khan for reporting and support to LRBT regarding project progress and related data.

8. LRBT organized two-day training on low vision at Korangi hospital in which two optometrists of THQ Sadiqabad were trained.

FHF Cataract surgeries



An agreement with LRBT was inked under "National Sight Restoring Project" requiring us to perform a total of 1,725 cataract surgeries at 3 LRBT designated hospitals from June 2021-November 2021. The target of 1,725 cataract surgeries was successfully performed during the period and concluded on schedule in November 2021.

Under a separate arrangement, FHF required us to perform 1100 sight restoring cataract surgeries during the month of November-December 2021 at 6 LRBT designated hospitals. We were able to achieve this target as planned.

OBAT CANADA



OBAT's purpose is to relieve poverty in developing nations, primarily in South Asia by providing support

to individuals in need through basic health care while LRBT is providing state of the art, comprehensive, quality free eye care in Pakistan.

An agreement was penned in October 2020 to conduct 2,238 sight restoring cataract surgeries over a period of one year. Under the project, these surgeries were carried out at our Korangi and North Karachi Hospitals. The project was successfully concluded in October 2021.

In another development, we have received two of the three equipment donated by Mr. Akbar Khimani for Korangi and Pasrur Hospitals. The third equipment is under shipment and is expected soon.

K-Electric



In the Public Health Category LRBT was recipient of KE KHI Award 2021

announced by the K-Electric Co. Ltd. This was followed by an agreement signed to conduct 1152 cataract surgeries at our Korangi and North Karachi Hospitals over a period of six months. This project was launched in June and successfully concluded in November 2021 by accomplishing the target of 1152 sight restoring cataract surgeries.

We are deeply appreciative for K-Electric Ltd's continued support.

Government of Sindh



A grant of Rs.80 million was graciously awarded to LRBT by the Government of Sindh for the fiscal year 2021-22 in an effort to alleviate curable blindness in the Province of Sindh.

We are required to perform 15,009 sight restoring cataract surgeries at all five of our Sindh Hospitals over a period of 12 months. This quarter's target of 3,752 surgeries was attained well before the end of December

We are grateful to the Sindh Government for their continued support.

A&A Company Formations DMCC- Dubai

Avastin injections are being administered to patients who are unable to afford this treatment being financed by the Company. This project began in May 2021 and shall conclude in April 2022. During the month of Oct-Dec 2021, 1,326 poor

patients received Avastin injections at ten of our designated Hospitals. A total of 4,635 Avastin injections will be administered over the project period.

We take this opportunity to thank A&A Company Formations- DMCC for their support.

Ebrahim AliBhai Charitable Trust

Poor and deserving patients are being financially supported through 250 cataract surgeries on a monthly basis at LRBT's North Karachi facility which was launched in January this year. During the period under review we were able to conduct 750 surgeries. A total of 3,158 cataract surgeries have so far been conducted under this project.

We are grateful to the Trust for their support.

HCI International

An agreement was inked with HCI to perform 3401 cataract surgeries at five designated Hospitals. This project commenced in July 2021. 1,501 cataract surgeries were carried out during the months of October and November 2021. We have been able to attain the target of 3401 surgeries as planned, and the project was successfully concluded in November 2021.

The objective was to deliver high quality cataract services to improve vision related quality of life and reduce blindness related poverty. The visit had been arranged by

COMSTECH with the collaboration of Islamic Development Bank (IsDB) under its Alliances to Fight Avoidable Blindness (AFAB) programme. LRBT Pakistan is partner of COMSTECH in this campaign.

The plan is to conduct more than 400 cataract eye surgeries and training workshops for learning cataract surgery with phacoemulsification under this campaign. Apart from clinics, the Pakistani team will also launch public awareness campaign about eye health.

The award was presented at the 36th Corporate Excellence Award Ceremony held at Marriott Hotels Karachi on 28th October, 2021.


GLT






