Umar Akmal Khan

Umar's Family's Story of Survival



Umar is the 16-year-old son of Muhammad Akmal Khan, a clerical worker in a private office in Karachi, earning a meager amount of Rs. 15,000. Umar's mother passed away last year, leaving behind 6 children: 2 sons and 4 daughters. He is the second eldest among his siblings and immediately after his mother passed away, his whole personality underwent a metamorphosis: from being a care-free child, he became a responsibility-bearing mature adult, helping his sister in looking after their siblings and their home.

He is not only a victim of poverty and illiteracy but has to handle responsibilities much beyond his years. School used to be his only solace, but recently his admission was cancelled as his father could not afford the fee. Umar's father, Muhammad Akmal, has sadness reflected in his eyes: "With the rising prices of rent, fuel, and groceries, education for my children seems like a far-fetched dream for now," he says.



What added to Umar's already challenging life was a constant pain in his left eye and difficulty with seeing clearly. His father took him to a nearby hakeem who used traditional remedies but to no avail. There were days when he would howl in pain and his eyes would tear up.

The final nail in the coffin was when his eyesight began to deteriorate rapidly and he was unable to see. Umar felt devastated: "I was so scared that I would lose my eyes. I did not have the heart to ask my father to take me to the hospital because I knew that money was tight."

Despite his efforts to put up a brave front, his pain

was too much to bear and he felt forced to ask for help. His father had no one to turn to. Due to his wife's prolonged illness, he was already knee-deep in loans. Akmal felt like he had hit rock bottom as all his requests for a loan were declined. As a last resort, he went to the same relative who had lent him money earlier to help with his wife's illness. He respected Akmal for his hard work and simplicity but could not offer further financial help. Instead, he advised him to go to LRBT's Korangi Hospital and also shared the best news that Akmal had heard in years – LRBT provides free eye care for the underprivileged.

Early next morning, he took Umar to LRBT Korangi. Throughout his journey, Akmal kept praying that LRBT would not turn out to be an NGO which falsely advertised free treatment. A very skeptical Akmal walked in with his young son, and thus began the journey towards healing for their whole family. Umar was given a complete eye examination: the doctors diagnosed traumatic cataract in his left eye and gave him an immediate date of surgery. When Akmal was assured that everything will be done for free, he started crying out of happiness and hugged Umar, expressing his gratitude to God and LRBT.

Umar's surgery was successful and his eyesight is now normal. For their family, it truly felt like a celebration. "I think my mother is blessing us from the heavens above," said Umar. They were touched by the care and affection shown by the hospital staff.

"I didn't know I was so strong until I was tested again and again. My aim in life now is to get an education for myself and my siblings. I will help my father in every way I can to ensure that we get educated. If there were more institutes like LRBT, underprivileged people like me won't have to suffer and go through the hardships like we did looking for free medical help. Thank you LRBT for giving me a second shot at life and the opportunity to become something. I will never take my eyesight for granted again" – Umar

The construction of Rahim Yar Khan Hospital is currently developing according to schedule. In the last quarter, the foundations and boundaries of the construction had been laid out. Currently, the plinth beam for 2 residences is being constructed and arrangements are being made for the plaster, plumbing, and electrical work for the residences. The brick masonry work is also in progress.

This project has been made possible through the full financial support of a UAE-based donor who helped with the purchase of land and construction of this hospital. In the past, he has sponsored major renovation and expansion costs at the Lar, Multan, Khanewal, Gambat hospitals & built a new hospital building at Mandra.

Outreach clinic at Tando Adam

After many requests by the locals at Tando Adam, and many renovations, preparations, and effort on our part, LRBT is proud to announce that we have now revived the operation theatre and patients have begun receiving quality treatments here. This is the first time revival of operations are being conducted at this facility.

PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENTS

LRBT gives credit to its partners for its success and is proud to work with them on ongoing projects:

Sightsavers



Sightsavers, in collaboration with LRBT, aims to reduce cataract burden in order to improve the cataract surgical rate in impoverished areas of Balochistan. A partnership agreement with LRBT was signed to perform a total of 6,853 cataract surgeries at Sibi and among the populace residing in the peripheral areas of Quetta, as well as Gwadar, and Turbat in the south western coast of Balochistan, over a period of three years. Between the months of October and December 2022, 386 surgeries were performed. The accumulated number of surgeries that have been performed under this project so far totals 3,556.

Brien Holden Foundation



During this quarter this year, we conducted OPD of 66,709 children of which 6,920 were refracted and 948 glasses are being provided under the 'Childrens' Vision Campaign'. LRBT also operates six optical shops at our Korangi, Gambat, Lar, Multan Road Lahore, Mandra, and Akora Khattak hospitals in collabo-

ration with BHF and provides quality eyewear at affordable prices to people who visit these facilities. This activity has added value as it provides quality eyewear at affordable prices in the premises of the hospitals. Another shop was added to the fold at Shahpur Hospital at the end of December 2022 and the second one will be added in the Rahimyar Khan Hospital when it becomes operational in June 2024.

CBM International



LRBT is implementing a multi-interventional inclusive eye health project titled, "Strengthening of Inclusive Eye Care Services in Rahim Yar Khan District", in collaboration and partnership with CBM (Christian Blind Mission). The prime goal of the project is to provide access to improved and inclusive eye health services in the district Rahim Yar Khan in South Punjab in collaboration with government health departments. This is being achieved by strengthening ophthalmic services at the primary and secondary health level by capacity-building measures for health staff in the region, by strengthening self-help groups and self-representative organizations (DPOs), and by systematic advocacy of district health authorities.

During the 4th quarter of 2022, the updates on

the project activities are as follows:

- **Eye Screening** - A total of 23,639 people were screened for eye diseases and refractive errors. Out of these, 4,860 were screened at Basic Health Units, 7,990 at Rural Health Centers, and 10,789 at Tehsil Head Quarter Hospital. Out of the total screened, 59% were female while 41% were male.
- **Referrals** - A total of 2,156 patients identified with eye problems were referred from the primary eye care centre to the secondary level for further diagnosis and treatments. Of these, 57% were female and 43% were male.
- **School Screening** - Under the School Screening component of the project, a total of 12,798 school children were screened during the reporting period. Out of these, 7,542 were boys and 5,256 were girls.
- **Training of Health Staff** - A Peek Acuity (Mobile App) was organized for school health and nutrition supervisors, optometrists and project staff. A total of 29 health staff (21 females, 8 males) were trained on vision screening with the Mobile App.
- **Eye Care Services Provision** – Under the IEH project, a total of 5,383 spectacles were prescribed. Out of these, 2,721 spectacles were provided to needy patients, free of cost. A total of 326 cataract surgeries were performed at THQ hospital, Sadiqabad, and 5 low vision aids were provided to the patients.
- **Accessibility Measures at Health Facilities**– A total of 28 health facilities have been made accessible for persons with disabilities during the reporting period. Accessibility measures included the construction of accessible washrooms, ramps, and handrails.

• **Introducing Peek Technology in Rahim Yar Khan - School Eye Health Component:**

Mr. Rizwan Younas, Project Officer, and Shahid Maqbool, IT Officer COAVS visited the project location and trained school health & nutrition supervisors, (17) optometrists, (8) and project staff on Peek Technology. A total of 27 mobile devices have been provided to trained cadres including the project team.

visited the project location to review progress. During the visit, Dr. Zahid Awan visited different RHCs and BHUs to review the project workflow. He also met the school health nutrition supervisor to assess their training on Peek. Furthermore, he had a meeting with the Deputy Commissioner Rahim Yar Khan and CEO DHA Rahim Yar Khan to get the District Inclusive Eye Health Committee notified. As a result of the meeting, a committee has been formed and relevant departments have been informed.

FHF Cataract Surgeries



The Fred Hollows Foundation

An agreement with LRBT was inked under 'National Sight Restoring Project' which required us to perform a total of 2,900 cataract surgeries at 5 LRBT designated hospitals from January 2022 till November 2022. The target of 2,900 cataract surgeries was successfully performed during the period and concluded as per schedule. Under a separate arrangement, FHF required us to perform 2,000 sight restoring cataract surgeries between the months of December 2022 and February 2023, at 4 LRBT designated hospitals.

LRBT is committed to providing state-of-the-art, comprehensive, high quality free eye care in Pakistan. An agreement was signed recently for acquisition of new medical equipment at our Odigram hospital to improve service delivery by providing the essentially required equipment to replace aging equipment.

OBAT CANADA



An agreement was signed in June 2022 to conduct 3,643 sight-restoring cataract surgeries over a period of six months. Under this project, these surgeries were carried out at 3 LRBT hospitals from July till December 2022. The target of 3,643 cataract surgeries was successfully achieved and concluded as per schedule in December 2022.

Mr. Akber Khimani, a philanthropic donor based in Canada, has made a generous offer to donate

urgently required ophthalmic equipment to LRBT for use at four of its hospitals. We have had issues regarding the letter of credit which caused delays – these have finally been sorted out now. We now expect the equipment to be available in the next quarter.

Government of Sindh



In an effort to alleviate curable blindness in the Province of Sindh, a grant of Rs.80 million was graciously awarded to LRBT by the Government of Sindh for the fiscal year 2022-23. We are required to perform 14,467 sight-restoring cataract surgeries at all five of our Sindh hospitals over a period of 12 months. This quarter's target of 3,617 surgeries was attained well before the end of this month. We are grateful to the Sindh Government for their continued support.

A&A Company Formations DMCC - Dubai

Under an understanding reached with A&A Company, Avastin injections financed by the company are being administered to patients unable to afford this treatment. This project began in May 2022 and shall conclude in April 2023. During the months of October, November, and December 2022, 1,889 underprivileged patients received Avastin injections at 11 of our designated hospitals. A total of 6,853 Avastin injections will be administered over the project period.

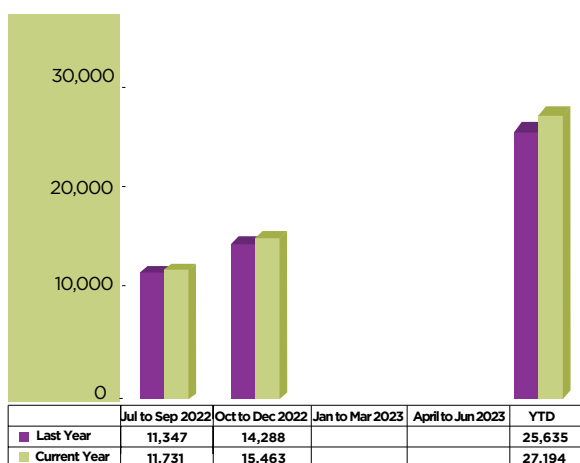

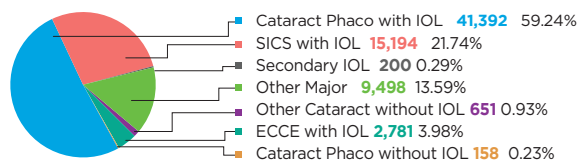
